



## SDG 1.3 University anti-poverty programmes

**1.3.3** - Does your university as a body provide support (e.g. food, housing, transportation, legal services) for students from low income families to enable them to complete university?

 Northern Technical University provides free <u>transportation</u> for targeted students, especially low-income students. Modern buses ensure that students can reach the university on time. Many bus routes and timetables are available.









The Northern Technical University has launched a mission to facilitate the transportation of students from various areas to the university campus, offering this service free of charge.

To support this initiative, the university has deployed mass transportation buses that cater to both male and female students, ensuring safe and efficient travel from their residences to different university locations and back. This service operates on a circular route, adhering to a set timetable for convenience.

In addition to transportation, the university has established comprehensive plans to enhance safety for its students and staff. This includes the availability of ambulances and civil defense vehicles to address emergencies effectively. The Northern Technical University plans to further enhance its transportation services by gradually introducing larger vehicles and additional buses dedicated to serving the student population during official hours, as well as before and after the day's classes.





Northern Technical University <u>Health Center (NTUHC)</u>



The Northern Technical University Health Center (NTUHC) is dedicated to delivering a wide range of health services designed to support the well-being of the entire academic community. With a focus on comprehensive care, NTUHC offers essential medical services, health education, and preventive measures to ensure that both students and staff have access to the resources they need to maintain their health. The center is committed to fostering a healthy environment conducive to learning and personal development, providing support for both physical and mental health needs within the university.







The university offers residential complexes for female students on campus, with a total capacity of 1,297 students. These complexes feature furnished rooms equipped with essential services, including internet access, cleaning, maintenance, fuel, and electricity. For male students, the university provides dormitories off-campus, accommodating 1,530 students. These dormitories include all necessary facilities and services. Additionally, the university collaborates with the General Company for Transporting Delegations and Passengers to facilitate transport for students traveling between the dormitories and the campus.

The university charges a dormitory fee of 30,000 dinars per academic year for each student which equivalent to \$20 and is a support and assistance to our dear students who benefit from these services. These facilities are distributed across three governorates: Nineveh, Salahaddin, and Kirkuk. Below are evidence from this residential complexes for the facilities provided.
























