Support for Bottom Financial Quintile Students

Northern Technical University is committed to empowering students from the lowest financial quintile by providing comprehensive support aimed at enhancing their success and creating job opportunities to combat poverty. The university has established a variety of initiatives, including:

Talent Development Programs: The university offers support for students to identify and cultivate their talents, enabling them to develop skills and talents that have the potential to generate financial returns for themselves and their families.

Investment Opportunities for Graduates: Northern Technical University has initiated several investment projects designed specifically for graduates, including a supermarket on campus, a cosmetics store, an electronic library, and a stationery shop. These ventures not only create job opportunities but also foster entrepreneurship among alumni.

Handicrafts and Art Exhibitions: The university hosts regular handicraft and art exhibitions, where students can showcase and sell their work. The proceeds from these exhibitions are directed towards supporting low-income families, helping to alleviate financial hardships while promoting local artists.








The College of Agricultural Technology organizes a bazaar for handicrafts..

To alleviate the burden on families during these blessed days, Northern Technical University has donated 125 Ramadan food baskets for the students residing in the dormitories of Northern Technical University in Kirkuk, many of whom have limited incomes.

These baskets have been distributed as follows: 100 baskets for the male students' dormitory, with one basket provided for each room, and 25 baskets for the female students' dormitory.
