SDG 1.4 Community anti-poverty programmes



The Northern Technical University launched the activities of the First Nineveh Entrepreneurship Forum, which coincided with the Global Entrepreneurship Week (GEW) held annually from November 13th to 16th. The forum aimed to present the importance of entrepreneurship through various activities and promote the exploration of pioneering innovation and entrepreneurship. The forum was also an expression of the initiative of the Iraqi Prime Minister, Mr. Muhammad Shiaa Al-Sudani, who launched the Reyada platform to strengthen the Iraqi entrepreneurial community by supporting emerging projects, developing creative thinking, improving youth skills, and building capacities. The activities of the first day also included an open session where consultants, business owners, academics, and civil society organizations answered the attendees' questions and inquiries regarding innovation and entrepreneurship.
