Committed to enhancing the educational experience, the library provides a wide array of essential services, including orientation programs, user training sessions, reference assistance, database exploration, internet connectivity, as well as photocopying and printing services.

The Northern Technical University Library is dedicated to curating a comprehensive and up-to-date collection of references, periodicals, and multimedia resources, sourced from leading international book suppliers and vendors based in the USA, UK, and the Middle East. Our commitment to accessibility and quality ensures that our students and faculty have the resources they need to succeed in their academic pursuits.

Membership

Northern Technical University Central Library (NTUCL) is open for the purpose of study and research to the following groups:

- Members of Academic and Non-academic staff of NTU.
- Registered students of NTU.
- Graduates and retired staff members of NTU.
- Members of Academic staff of other Iraqi universities.
- Students of other Iraqi universities.

The NTU Central Library provides the following services to its users:

- Reference and User Education.
- Online Catalogs.
- Audiovisuals/Multimedia.

- Photocopy Service. E-printing service.
- Group Study Rooms.
- Interlibrary Document Delivery.

General Rules:

- All registered readers are presumed to know the Library regulations which are included in the Student handbooks and available in the Library and on the Library's web pages. Any amendments to these regulations are displayed in the Library.
- All members of the Library staff are authorized to inspect any books in possession of users leaving the Library.

General Behavior:

- Individuals aged 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Adults bringing children or minors into the Library are responsible for monitoring their activities.
- Prior approval from the Library Administration must be obtained before posting fliers and signs or distributing leaflets in the Library.
- Headphones must be used when listening to audio materials. The volume should be set at a level that ensures the sound is not audible to others.
- Cell phone conversations should be brief and conducted in a low voice. If an extended conversation is necessary, please go outside the designated phone area or the building.

Central Library Computer Use Policy:

- Public workstations in the Northern Technical University <u>central library</u> are available for research, learning, and scholarship.
- All members of the NTU community will be given priority over non-NTU patrons in the use of public workstations for research and learning.
- NTU students will be given priority in the Library Reference area.
- NTU students, faculty, and staff will be required to use their ID and password to access the public workstations.
- Public workstations will be available with a guest login for community users and other non-NTU patrons.

- Patrons who have laptop computers can connect to NTU's wireless network in the library.
- Wireless service is reserved for NTU members only, if a patron is not affiliated with NTU and wishes to use the university wireless services.
- All users must adhere to the University Information and Communication Technology Policy.
