College of Agricultural Technology Hosts Seminar on Combating Domestic Violence

Educational and Community Engagement: Activating the roles of schools, universities, and mosques to promote religious awareness and educate individuals about their rights and responsibilities regarding violence. Additionally, spreading awareness about legal consequences for perpetrators of domestic violence is essential.

Promoting Peaceful Conflict Resolution: Encouraging community members to engage in amicable problem-solving and conflict resolution. It is also crucial to publicize the helplines of Community Police (497) and the Directorate of Family and Child Protection from Domestic Violence (139) to ensure that individuals have access to necessary support.

Through these initiatives, the College of Agricultural Technology is committed to building a safer and more informed community. By fostering awareness and collaboration, we can work together to effectively reduce domestic violence and support those in need.

"Your warm welcome brings us joy, and we extend a heartfelt greeting to our esteemed guests. We look forward to celebrating this vibrant occasion together."





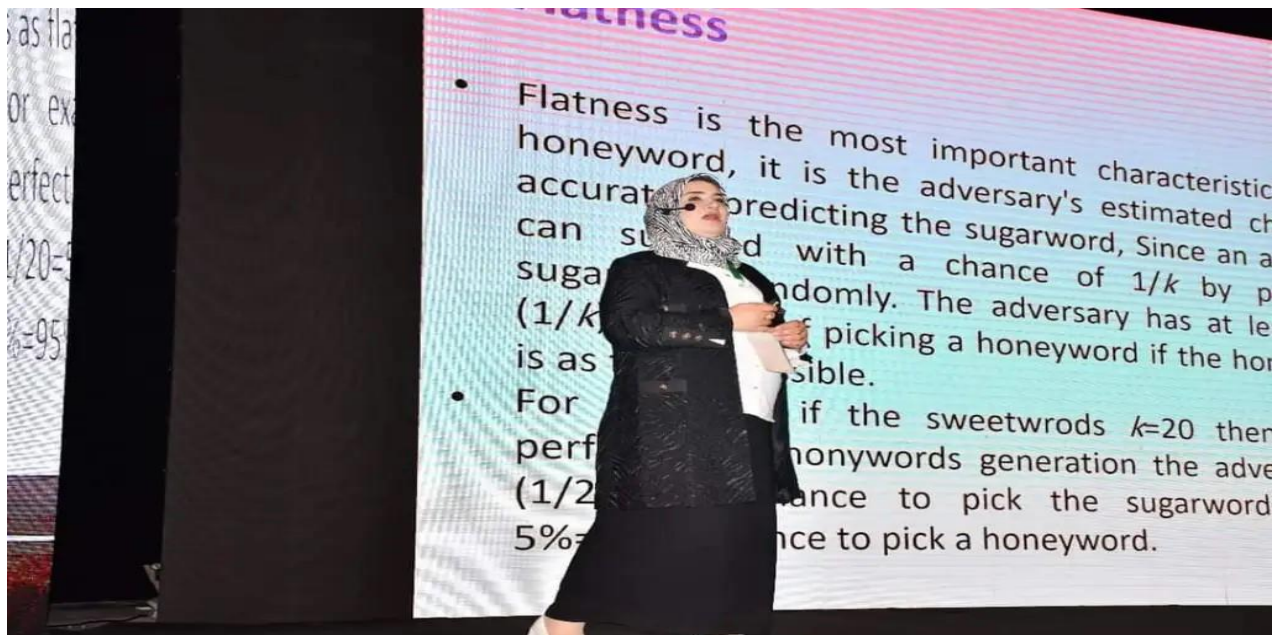


Kirkuk Festival of Technology and Creativity
